Sunday 25th November Sermon Notes - 'Where is the Love?'

This is a good question to ask when we look around us at the world in which we live – the images coming out of Yemen, the 'caravan' of people at the border between Mexico and the USA and the destruction of Syria.

Read Luke 18:35-19:10

- What were the factors that caused these two people to be on the outside of 'Life' i.e. set apart from and excluded from the life of the community?
- Can you identify other occasions when lesus encountered individuals or groups of people who were on the 'outside'? What were the reasons for them being separated and set apart?
- What does lesus do in each case when he comes across a person in need?

Read slowly I John 4:7-21 and ask the Holy Spirit to highlight a particular word, phrase or verse that stands out for you. Go round the group and share what stood out for you?

How might the Holy Spirit be speaking to you about expressing the love of lesus more fully in your life? Is there a group of people (or a person) he is putting on your heart to go to and demonstrate His love? What is stopping you?

Martin Buber, the Jewish Philosopher tells us how in civilisations and cultures where there are a lot of things we become less available to people to be with them

to understand them

to share with them.

We get caught up with things; having things, doing things, selling and buying things. We risk forgetting that the joy and treasure of human beings is to be with other human beings and to celebrate life together, (hence your Life group).

How can you as a group celebrate Christmas and invite others into your celebrations and avoid being caught up with things?

Pray for one another that as a group and individually we may demonstrate the love of Jesus in word and action as we reach out to those who find themselves on the outside and excluded from 'life in all its fullness'.



Joelle's testimony

When I was born my parents chose my name because of the verse about the coming of the Holy Spirit in Joel 2:28. I grew up in a Christian family with three siblings.
