Reading: Mark 1:40-45

A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean."

⁴¹ Jesus was indignant. He reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!" ⁴² Immediately the leprosy left him and he was cleansed.

⁴³ Jesus sent him away at once with a strong warning: ⁴⁴ "See that you don't tell this to anyone. But go, show yourself to the priest and offer the sacrifices that Moses commanded for your cleansing, as a testimony to them." ⁴⁵ Instead he went out and began to talk freely, spreading the news. As a result, Jesus could no longer enter a town openly but stayed outside in lonely places. Yet the people still came to him from everywhere.

Sermon Notes Sunday 16th February 2020 The Divine Exchange – Turning Ashes into something Beautiful

God takes lives and changes them. He takes the remains of what we have left, like when a fire has gone out and all we have is ashes. He makes them beautiful. A miracle happens. A Divine Exchange! He exchanges our worthless lives and makes them whole. Just like the leper. He gave beauty for Ashes. Because he is compassionate.

Read Mark I:4-45

Other texts to read: Isaiah 6: I-3, Luke 4:14-21, Zechariah 1:16, Psalm 103:7-8

- I. Describe the 'Divine Exchange' as seen in Ps 103:1-5
- 2. Compare Isaiah 61:1-3 with Luke 4: 14-21
- How would you describe beauty for ashes the 'Divine Exchange' God takes that which is worthless, the remains of something, and replaces it with something beautiful. God takes the hopeless and makes it hope-full....
- 4. What characters in the Old Testament can you think of where God takes Ashes and Exchanges them?
- In Mark, Jesus comes to the leper He is moved with compassion. Compare this story with: Matthew 14:14, 15:12, 20:34, Mark 6:34, 8:2, Romans 9:15 and James 5:11 What Patterns can you see?
- 6. In Luke 4 Jesus (quoting Isaiah 61:1-3) said 'Today this scripture is fulfilled.' How did Isaiah become fulfilled for the leper?
- 7. The nature of Jesus reflects God Compassionate and taking worthless lives. Discuss.
- 8. How do you feel about what you have heard from the Bible? How does it make you feel about approaching God?
